The humdrum life of the typical Japanese <u>salaryman</u> involves a long daily commute, an occasional night on the town and little in the way of drama. But the samurai spirit lives on in the soul of these <u>workaday</u> warriors, ready to emerge when needed. Such a moment challenged Toshio Yamauchi, 49, an electrical company employee, as he waited for his morning subway train in Osaka last week. A teenager **suddenly** fainted and fell from the platform, striking her head on the rails so that she lay <u>senseless</u> in the path of an oncoming train. Yamauchi jumped onto the rails, waved his arms to halt the approaching train, then carried the unconscious girl to safety. Subway authorities say that his quick action saved the life of high school student Rumiko Machida, 17. If Yamauchi had waited a moment longer to consider the danger to himself, the driver would not have been able to stop the train in time to avoid <u>hitting</u> the girl. Yamauchi, who received a formal letter of thanks from the Osaka metropolitan police, was modest about the incident. "My own child is about the same age," he said, "so I'm happy I could do something to help."
